

As Psychiatric Mental Health Nurses in all areas of healthcare, we take a frontline role in helping others towards an equilibrium and sense of security in their own mental health and overall wellbeing. With the Holiday Season upon us, statistically we understand the increase in anxiety, depression, and suicide attempts in the general population. There is the simple mnemonic to remember: IS PATH WARM.

I Ideation: Verbalization of negative thoughts

S Substance Abuse: Increased substance use (alcohol or illicit/prescription drug)

P Purposelessness: No reason for living; no sense of purpose in life

A Anxiety: Anxiety, agitation, unable to sleep or sleeping all of the time

T Trapped: Feeling trapped – where there is no way out

**H Hopelessness**: Verbalizing Hopelessness

W Withdrawal: Withdrawal from friends, family, and society

A Anger: Rage, uncontrolled anger, seeking revenge

**R Recklessness**: Acting reckless or engaging in risky activities, seemingly without thinking

M Mood Changes: Dramatic mood changes

Know the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline: 1-800-273-8255. This number is answered by professionals 24 hours, 7 days a week including Holidays. You can save a life of someone you don't know.

Two other things: APNA's 30<sup>th</sup> National Convention was held in Hartford, CT from October 18-22. It was attended by over 1600 Psychiatric nurses from all over the country and internationally. The Florida Chapter had a good turnout of members taking advantage of the educational sessions and networking.

Other noteworthy National News: The first-ever Surgeon General's Report on Alcohol, Drugs, and Health was recently released. The report reviews what we know about substance misuse and how you can use that knowledge to address substance misuse and related consequences.
