

Competencies for Suicide Prevention

Recently, we lost two very prominent individuals to suicide. This is a reminder to each of us how fragile life can be. Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States (CDC, 2015), becoming a public health issue impacting surviving families and our communities. It is imperative as psychiatric and mental health nurses that we understand the phenomenon of suicide and specific therapeutic interventions.

APNA has created a Competency Based Training for Suicide

Prevention (APNA, 2015). This training program will assist practitioners in developing skills which can help with identifying risk factors and protective factors for suicide as well as determining risk level and interventions.
