Spotlight on: Maureen Kolomeir, PMHNP-BC, MBA

The American Psychiatric Nurses Association New Mexico Chapter is relatively new. Maureen is one of the original officers of the Chapter. She was one of a small group of dedicated nurses who revitalized the NM Chapter, and she continues to contribute to its growth and success.

Maureen began her career as a nurse 25 years ago, 23 of those years have been in behavioral health. She graduated from an ADRN program and began her career as an oncology nurse. She continued her career working in various aspects of behavior health. In 2005, she was awarded the New Mexico Nurse of Excellence for BH. As the project manager at Kaseman Hospital, she instituted the healing gardens for adult and child units. While serving as a 2nd Lieutenant in the US Army, Maureen was responsible for Suicide Prevention. That interest continued in civilian life when she developed methods for suicide prevention, which were adopted by Presbyterian statewide and published nationally by HCPro. She was also a presenter at the SW Nursing Research Conference in 2003 where she presented original qualitative research on caregiver's experience w dementia.

Six years ago, Maureen began her practice as a PMHNP-BC. She owns Kolomeir Clinic located in Albuquerque, NM. Kolomeir Clinic is one of the few BH Clinics that accept Medicare patients. Her clinic is based on a primary care, integrative medicine model, which includes dream-tending therapy and Tibetan Medicine. In addition, Maureen makes psychiatric home health visits to group homes if a client is unable to attend clinic appointments. Halak, her German Shepherd, contributes to the success of the clinic, as a therapy dog. She provides genealogical testing for psychotropic medications, which is another unique aspect of her clinic. Her clinic is a Safe Space for LGBTQ community. Maureen welcomes and is a mentor for students who would like a clinical experience in her clinic.

Maureen's other accomplishments include: professional opera singer, speaks English French and Hebrew and taught Hebrew. She is a leader of the Chevra Kadisha for women (burial society). She is a published poet, musician, and was a songwriter for the group Shangoya in the 80's. Maureen has two adult children (son is a Buddhist monk) and two grandchildren.

Maureen values education, and in addition to her current degrees, she is pursuing a Leadership DNP, through UNM College of Nursing.

Bryan Krumm is the recipient of the "Author of the Year" award by *The Nurse Practitioner Journal.* He won the award for the article "Cannabis for posttraumatic stress disorder: A neurobiological approach to treatment. The award will be presented to him April 19, 2017 at the Conference for Primary and Acute Care Clinicians.

Bryan Krumm MSN, RN, PMHNP, BC is a Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner and the director of Harmony Psychiatric, LLC in Albuquerque New Mexico. He specializes in the nonpharmaceutical treatment of PTSD and provides comprehensive evidence based psychiatric care to patients with a variety of disorders using Cannabis, dietary supplementation, diet, exercise and Mindful Awareness. He helped author New Mexico's Medical Cannabis law and included language that allows Advanced Practice Nurses to refer patients to the program. He maintains over a thousand patients in New Mexico's Medical Cannabis Program for PTSD and has been able to help many of them move away from pharmaceuticals. He is a Veteran of the US Army. He has been recognized as a top advocate for Veterans by High Times magazine and as a Leader in Nursing by Cannabis Nurses Magazine. In 2009, he filed a rescheduling petition for Cannabis with the DEA. In August 2017 the DEA denied Krumm's petition, but was forced to ease restrictions against Cannabis research and admit that Cannabis does not cause psychosis, does not cause lung cancer, is not a "gateway drug" and that it does not cause permanent cognitive deficits.
