

# Dear Colleagues,

It is my pleasure to present your 2020 American Psychiatric Nurses Association (APNA) Annual Activity Report. I am happy to share that your association continues the trend of steady membership growth and retention. Please see <u>APNA Secretary Joyce Shea's report</u> for information on membership and other updates. APNA has also enjoyed a sound financial year – <u>APNA Treasurer Donna Rolin's report</u> provides the details.

APNA activities are guided by a strategic direction developed by the APNA Board of Directors (BOD). Below I call out some notable APNA accomplishments that are in line with the four goals set out in our strategic plan – as well as the significance of these accomplishments to you. Though a lengthy list, it is well worth your time to review it. The generous gifts of your time and expertise enrich our efforts as illustrated in this inventory of achievements - a source of pride for our dedicated psychiatric-mental health nursing community.

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# Dear Colleagues,

As the Secretary for the APNA Board of Directors, I am pleased to provide you with this annual update on our membership and communications over the past year.

The APNA Secretary is responsible for corporate records and taking meeting minutes during official meetings of the APNA Board of Directors. During the past year, the Board of Directors conducted face-to-face meetings on October 1, 2019, February 19-20, 2020, and June 10, 2020. Conference calls were held on November 12, 2019; December 10, 2019; January 14, 2020; March 10, 2020; April 14, 2020; May 12, 2020; July 14, 2020; August 11, 2020; and September 8, 2020.

Membership has increased since the last activity report. Current membership is up 5% at 14,570, with a 6.5% increase in renewals and a 1.2% increase in new members as compared to 2019. Our retention rate is a healthy 85% and our membership is currently 55.66% RN and 44.34% APRN.

The website continues to help APNA serve as your resource for psychiatric-mental health nursing. This year, APNA created a robust website section devoted to resources and information to help psychiatric-mental health nurses navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. APNA also continues to issue press releases, conduct press outreach, and make use of a broad range of social media platforms to disseminate information and engage with the public. New resources now available on the website thanks to the expertise found within our membership include an SBIRT Pocket Card for Nurses, a Nurses Guide to Mental Health Support and Services, and a stress self-assessment with targeted resources.

Since its launch in 2011, your resource for online continuing nursing education, the <u>APNA</u> <u>eLearning Center</u>, continues to grow in scope and reach. More than 373 sessions are available to access online, altogether offering 414.2 contact hours. 'Free CE of the Month' provides members with access to four free podcasts with contact hours each month. This year APNA also released two new <u>free sessions</u> to help nurses manage increased stress during this time: Mindfulness in the Workplace: Practical Application and Cultivating Our Best Selves in Response to COVID-19: The Community Resiliency Model. Also, the two Medications for Addictions Treatment webinars, available at no cost in partnership with the Provider's Clinical Support System, were updated with new and enhanced content.

Our online community site <u>Member Bridge</u> continues to offer valuable connection for members. The community provides more than 107,000 resources, discussion posts, and blogs and members have logged in more than 924,000 times to access this content. This year, members sent more than 24,000 messages and wrote more than 8,000 posts in their communities. This site serves as a dynamic source for the collective wisdom, experiences, and concerns shared by the profession. I hope that you will join me in celebrating the growth that APNA has seen this past year – it is a collective effort that reflects your dedication and expertise as members of your association of professionals.




# Dear Colleagues,

I am pleased to provide the APNA Treasurer's Report for the most recent fiscal year, 2019. The audited financial statements for the year ending December 31, 2019 can be found in the Appendix. This report shows the complete APNA financial position to include foundation activities. All APNA financials are under the stewardship of the APNA Board of Directors. The results show a positive return from operations of \$37,329.


In an effort to oversee the integrity of its financial statements and maintain a system of internal control, APNA established an Audit Committee to review the results of the audited financial statements with the independent auditing firm annually. Last year's audit resulted in a "clean" opinion with no material misstatements.

In addition to the statements discussed above, we have prepared the following charts reflecting the revenues and expenses and the net operating results from January 1, 2005 through December 31, 2019.





The Board of Directors functions as the investment committee for APNA funds. It utilizes the services of an investment manager who invests the funds in accordance with the APNA investment policy. The investment policy calls for a diversification of funds with moneys invested in cash, equities, bonds and real estate. The following charts show the results of APNA investments from July 2003 through August 2020. APNA investments have returned a total of \$1,219,635 over that period.

# Chapter Activity Report September 2020

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#### Education

#### **Current Activities:**

Pre-Licensure and Graduate Branches: Discussing COVID-19 response — resources to be posted on Member Bridge (this was completed last spring as an initial offering) relative to focusing on virtual teaching during the pandemic.

- Pre-Licensure: discussion groups continue to support projects addressing civility, empathy/antistigma, NCLEX "next generation questions", student resilience, and updating the Undergraduate Education Toolkit.
- Graduate: As above, COVID-19 challenges are being addressed for graduate/preceptor hours with telehealth and tele preceptor - modalities being discussed; the hope is to inform nurse educators to better understand options for graduate student supervision with virtual contact hours as these are being more fully realized across the country. A survey to further examine teaching options for graduate faculty instruction during the pandemic is being created. The survey is intended to identify which resources are used to support "therapy" in the graduate curriculum and what is being done to facilitate supervised/supervision relative to therapeutic contact hours.
- Continuing Education: The group is discussing the theme of suicide per best educational strategies
  with members of the steering committee to approach guided instruction on use of suicide risk
  surveys and other tools ex: how to use the Columbia Suicide Risk Severity Rating Scale; the group is
  also working on developing a database secondary to the accumulation of new information (new
  literature and dissemination from credible sources like CDC and SAMHSA) on the effect of COVID-19
  on mental health working on objectives and goals for forming a project group.

# If your council could advise the board on one thing that APNA should accomplish relative to your council's area of expertise, what would it be?

The board should support dissemination of best practices created by Education Council groups for teaching during the pandemic. This offering on dedicated areas of the APNA website could create easily accessed and noticed tabs or prominent areas providing new and novel resources for constituent nurse educators at the undergraduate and graduate levels. 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#### **Forensic Psychiatric Nurses**

#### **Current Activities:**

- 32 attendees at the October 2019 Forensic Council Panel voiced a need to identify the specialized skill-set needed to deliver quality nursing care to psychiatric-forensic patients.
- November 2019, Co-chair Perkins engaged in a review of the literature and found a tool with psychometric properties that measures the quality of forensic-psychiatric care among patients and nurses surveyed in multiple countries outside of the USA.
- Feb 2020, Co-chairs submitted a briefing paper to the BOD that requested using this psychometric tool in the USA. The briefing paper was not approved due to APNA's research policy guidelines.
- May 2020, APNA requested and received suggestions from the Co-chairs on how to structure Zoom conversations for an online "Well-Being" format designed to support all nursing specialties impacted due to COVID19.
- September 2020, in lieu of a formal survey, Co-chairs submitted a request to APNA's membership to
  describe what skills and training the members believe are needed to provide quality psychiatricforensic nursing.

#### **Stress Screening & Resources for Nurses Workgroup**

APNA partnered with the American Nurses Foundation, American Nurses Association, Emergency Nurses Association, and the American Association of Critical-Care Nurses to help support the wellbeing needs of frontline nurses. One of APNA's projects with this group was to develop an interactive online experience for nurses that can be embedded on an organization website to self-assess ones stress levels by using an evidence-based tool followed by identifying and hosting online resources that align with the assessment an(Nurses who complete the assessment will be directed to resources targeted to their results.)

APNA identified and invited 17 people of varying geographic and practice locations, as well as expertise, to join the workgroup.

- Reviewed the Perceived Stress Scale for use as the self-assessment tool.
- Suggested vetted resources and indicated appropriateness for categories of high, moderate, and low stress.
  - Low 38 resources shared
  - Moderate -17 resources shared
  - High 12 resources shared
  - Total 67 resources shared
- Thorough evaluation process for resources through comments on Member Bridge, utilization of
  resource evaluation tool based on the APA mobile app evaluation framework, and a ranking of the
  top 10 resources in each category via an online form.
- Further categorized the resources, considering time commitment, accessibility, personal preferences, etc: Peer Support, Guided Relaxation, Exercise, Apps, Workbooks, Self-Care Toolkit, Webinars, Quick Activities, Information & Tips, Immediate Help
- Provided expert feedback on the contextual language used both in the tool itself, and on the resource webpages, with a goal of speaking to nurses in an appropriate and sensitive way.
- Resource now live at <u>www.apna.org/wellbeinginitiative</u> and on ANA website.

## APNA Education Report October 2020

#### Accreditation Language from ANCC: Nursing Continuing Professional Development (NCPD)

The American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation has issued a new accreditation statement for continuing nursing education. The updated language is intended to promote **professional development** in nursing and to be inclusive of nursing education related to nonclinical settings like policy and academic education. The new statement will appear on all continuing professional development certificates: *The American Psychiatric Nurses Association is accredited with distinction as a provider of nursing continuing professional development by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation.* 

#### **APNA Transitions in Practice Certificate Program (ATP)**

The APNA Transitions in Practice (ATP) Certificate Program is a 15-hour online course that was originally developed in 2015. The program is intended to:

- Provide foundational evidence-based psychiatric-mental health education to all RNs.
- Provide educational support for nurses as they transition from the classroom to clinical practice.
- Provide RNs with a resource for reliable, evidence-based, best practices and psychiatric-mental health continuing education.
- Highlight the importance of the mental health care provided by RNs in a way that is highly visible to institutions, consumers, other nursing/healthcare professionals, and the general public

This course is currently being updated. A tentative timeline is in place to launch this course by November 2020.

- 98 organizations have purchased a combined total of 3,737 seats as a part of the bulk purchase program
- 1,615 individual registrations with 4,148 contact hours earned

#### **APNA Chapter Education**

APNA as Continuing Nursing Education Provider

Due to COVID-19 and stay at home orders in most states, there were no live chapter conferences held in 2020. APNA has continued to work with chapters to decide on next steps for education activities. Two virtual conferences were held with help from chapter support and the provider unit.

- Kentucky (KY) Held a virtual conference June 18, approved for 4.5 NCPD contact hours. Of the 29 registered participants, 16 claimed credit.
- Nebraska (NE)- Held a virtual conference August 14, approved for 6 NCPD contact hours. Of the 28 registered participants, 16 claimed credit.

Chapter Programs: Competency Based Training for Suicide Prevention: PMH Nurse Generalist

- 16 APNA Chapters provided the APNA suicide prevention training in 2019
- 6 Chapters postponed the *Competency Based Training for Suicide Prevention: PMH Nurse Generalist* rescheduled dates pending

#### Competency Based Training for Suicide Prevention: PMH Nurse Generalist

- More than 3,500 nurses and other professionals have been trained since September 2016\*
- All new trainings were cancelled or postponed in Spring, 2020 due to COVID restrictions.
- 23 trainings are scheduled for Fall
- Online renewal course
- The Competency Based Training for Suicide Prevention provider cards expire after 3 years. Many
  organizations require their staff to take this course and have current provider cards. Based on
  feedback from the course evaluations, facilitators and organizations, APNA is developing an
  online renewal course for expired suicide prevention providers. An APNA member work group
  of experts is currently working on the renewal course curriculum. The projected completion of
  the renewal course is early 2021.
- APNA Facilitator Trainings
  - 88 facilitators completed the course since 2015
  - o 7 nurses successfully completed the Spring 2020 Facilitator Training.
  - o The revised format consisted of:
    - 15-week hybrid course online with a 2-day training and testing\*\*
    - Provides 15 nursing continuing professional development contact hours
    - Began February 9, 2020 with 16 registrants ended June 30, 2020\*\*\*
    - Current plans include 1 facilitator training per year
    - There are 12 people on the waiting list for the 2021 facilitator training
    - \*\*Due to travel and meeting limitations, the training and testing was converted and effectively implemented using a 2-day virtual live format
    - \*\*\*The impact of COVID-19 caused 9 of the 16 registrants choosing to defer to the Spring 2021 facilitator training course.

#### Competency Based Training for Suicide Prevention – Acute Care Settings

This program was adapted from the original *Competency Based Training for Suicide Prevention: PMH Nurse Generalist Role* one-day training. The intent of the program is so that all nurses can be a part of suicide prevention.

- A facilitator-led 1.5 hour live, interactive course
- Provides foundational knowledge to non-PMH nurses regarding phenomenology of suicide, risk factors, warning signs, safety plan and creating a safe environment.
- Meets CMS Meaningful Measures (Making Care Safer, Promote Effective Prevention & Treatment of Chronic Disease and Promotes Effective Communication & Coordination of Care)
- Workbooks and slides have been updated to include the July 2019 Joint Commission National Patient Safety Goal 15.01.01: Suicide requirements
- Uses an algorithm:
  - Help assess and determine risk for suicide

Able to communicate and document the risk and safety interventions.

#### **Programs**

- As of August 2020:
  - o 6 organizations have leased the program
  - 52 registrants have completed the live 1.5-hour training

## Medication For Addiction Treatment (MAT) Training for Nurses (Formerly Medication Assisted Treatment)

Under the 2016 Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (CARA) Nurse Practitioners (NPs) are eligible to obtain a MAT waiver after completing 24 hours of approved coursework. In October 2018, the bill was signed into law to permanently authorize NPs to prescribe MAT and it extends authorization to Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNSs) until October 1, 2023.

- All healthcare providers must obtain a MAT waiver from the DEA to prescribe buprenorphine, (one of three FDA-approved medications for treating opioid use disorders)
- The 24-hour course content was reviewed and updated in communication with American Academy of Addiction Psychiatry (AAAP) and APNA.
  - o The updated MAT 16-hour course opened at the end of February 2020
  - o In partnership with the Providers' Clinical Support System (PCSS), APNA offers NCPD credit for the MAT waiver courses.
  - o The updated MAT 8-hour course was released at the end of April 2020.

#### **8 Hour Training**

- 21,598 individuals registered (additional 3,254 this quarter)
- 14,213 individuals completed (additional 2,294 this guarter)

#### 16 Hour Training

- 21,484 individuals registered (additional 3,164 this quarter)
- 15,182 individuals completed (additional 2,322 this quarter)

- Programs were FREE to members and non-members
- 237 individuals registered in total for the programs
- 71 individuals completed the program and claimed certificates
- 568 contact hours were awarded

#### **Program Updates**

#### APNA Certificate Program: Understanding the Brain-Behavior Connection

This eLearning educational certificate offering provides RNs and APRNs insight into the importance of understanding brain functions and their influence on behaviors. The final module in the offering provides pictures of brains and examples of behaviors associated with interrupted or altered brain physiology.

- This certificate program was launched in July 2019
- The course awards 5.0 contact hours upon completion
- 662 participants have registered for this program

#### **Motivational Interviewing**

This three-hour e-Learning program provides RNs and APRNs with an introduction to Motivational Interviewing and how to apply it to nursing practice. It discusses the core principles of Motivational Interviewing and provides case studies for practice.

- 3.0 contact hour web-based, modularized program
- This program was launched in September 2019
- 10,790 participants have registered for this program

2019 Effective Treatments for Opioid Use Disorder: Educating & Empowering Nurses During an Epidemic

The updated courses (RN and APRN) were released August 2019

2019 Seclusion and Restraint: Assessment and Risk Mitigation

This e-Learning program educates nurses of the risks associated with seclusion and restraint, and the ability for nurses to mitigate these risks and recognize the readiness for release.

- This program was updated and released in September 2019

### 2020 Competency Based Training for Conducting the One Hour Face-to-Face Assessment for Patients in Restraints or Seclusion

This e-Learning program provides the key components for assessing a patient placed in restraint or seclusion as a result of behavior that may be dangerous to self or others.

- This program was updated and released March 2020
- This update includes an animated simulation of how to conduct the one-hour face-to-face assessment for patients in restraints or seclusion.
- 480 participants have registered for this course since March 2020 (registrants more than tripled in this quarter)

#### **Collaborative Projects**

#### **APA CSS-SMI Project**

APNA is collaborating with APA as the provider of NCPD credit for this 5 year grant funded project. Education on SMI evidence-based practices is made available at no charge on the smiadvisor.org website, to a multidisciplinary audience of providers.

- There were 24 activities produced in 2019.
- NCPD approval is granted for one year after the activity is available. Each enduring activity is
  then reviewed to determine if contact hours can be extended for one more year. The 2019
  activities are currently being reviewed for extension.
- There have been 13 new webinars produced thus far in 2020.

## SAMHSA/APNA Prac-Ed: Integrating Substance Use Disorder, Screening and Assessment into Treatment (FOA No. FG-19-001) Substance Use -The Basics: Integrating SBIRT and MI

In September 2019, APNA was awarded a 2-year grant from SAMHSA to develop and deliver education to 10 universities. The education content was to include substance use, SBIRT and motivational interviewing with an overall project goal to infuse this content into nursing education curriculum. With guidance and input from a member committee, APNA developed a 6-hour interactive live program that provides an overview of substance use disorders and emphasizes why this knowledge is important to ALL nursing practice. The full day program includes group discussion, small group practice and role play. The education is being delivered as live, virtual education via Zoom in full-day or 2 half-day sessions.

- As of Sept 1, 2020, nine university programs were delivered.
- Program exceeded the goal to deliver content to 200 students 400 students and faculty registered and attended the live virtual program.
- 6.0 NCPD contact hours awarded to participants who completed the program.
- Audiences: pre-licensure nursing, PMHNP certificate, FNP and public health students and faculty.
- Student and faculty feedback: extremely positive related to learning practical communication skills and the inclusion of practice time for motivational interviewing.
- A 30-day follow up survey was sent to all students and faculty to request feedback on "usefulness" and the application of what was learned.
- Ten additional universities will participate with APNA and SAMHSA in grant year 2.
